**T**ime for another update from the Philippines. We were in New Zealand during April and May and returned shortly after the start of the school year. While we were away there was a summer camp held and we are grateful for those who gave freely of their time to organise and run the programs.

Since returning we have seen the addition of a 13 year old girl and shortly a 10 year old boy will join us. Imelda who graduated last March with a degree in education has stayed on to help look after the girls because Angie our mother to them left to continue her studies in Manila. We are still seeking a permanent replacement.

John and Nilda have just returned from a trip to the islands of Samar and Leyte, south of us, accessible by ferry and the famous San Juanico Bridge joining Samar to Leyte. We distributed books and teaching on

behalf of Derek Prince Ministries to Pastors and Bible Schools in Tacloban City and several towns. Derek Prince ministries continues to grow in the Philippines and we have a new web site [www.dpmphilippines.org](http://www.dpmphilippines.org). Along that line we have also been involved in distributing Bibles to High Schools and two army camps. On 16th August we will give 8,200 New Testaments to Sorsogon National High School.

As usual our feeding programs have been carrying on and we are appreciate those who give to enable us to help the poorest of the poor.

Our church plant is slowly coming together, although we need someone to take it over and do the pastoral work their.

The children all had dental check ups which resulted in 51 fillings being done and many extractions, for most it was their first visit to the dentist and a lot of gentle persuasion was needed to get them all attended too, especially when it came to the extractions.
